


South Africa - Knowledge Organizer (Meriden Year 4 Spring term)

Yocabulary dozen

biome - A large region of Earth that has a certain climate and certain types of living things for example grassland, savannah or desert.

food chain - The connections between different organisms (plants and animals) that rely on one another as their source of food.

producer - An organism or plant that is able to absorb energy from the sun.

predator - An animal that eats other animals.

prey - An animal that is eaten by other animals.

equator - An imaginary line around the middle of the Earth at an equal distance from the North Pole and the South Pole.

ocean - A very large body of water that covers roughly 70% of the earth.

continent - A very large area of land, such as Africa or Asia, that consists of several countries.

racism - Racism is where someone thinks you're inferior (lower) because of your colour, ethnicity, nationality or race.

activist - someone who campaigns to bring about change.

segregation - Separating people out.

apartheid - A political system in South Africa in which people were divided into racial groups and kept apart by law.

Nelson Mandela

- 1. Born in South Africa in 1918.
- 2. Joins the African National Congress (ANC) group to protest against the government's unfair treatment of black people.
- 3. South African government introduces system of apartheid in 1948
- 4. Arrested in 1962, sentenced to life imprisonment. Spends 27 years in prison.
- 5. Awarded with the Nobel Peace Prize in 1993.
- 6. Becomes the first black president of South Africa in 1994. This is the first election where black people are allowed to vote.
- 7. Dies in 2013. There is a national week of mourning in South Africa.
